

MD HUB FAQ

1. What is an MD Hub status?

An MD Hub is a Government-recognised collaborative space that serves as a catalyst for the development of a comprehensive and interconnected digital ecosystem.

It brings together startups, scale-up companies, enterprises, accelerators, venture builders, corporates, technology companies, and investors within a collaborative and synergistic environment to drive innovation, sustainable growth, and value creation.

2. What are the implications for existing Malaysia Digital Hub (MDH) certified locations?

Existing Malaysia Digital Hub (MDH) certified locations may transition to MD Hub recognition, subject to meeting and complying with the MD Hub Criteria and applicable requirements.

3. Who is eligible to apply for MD Hub status?

Co-working space operators are eligible to apply for MD Hub recognition, subject to meeting the eligibility requirements and compliance standards set out under the MD Hub Criteria.

4. Are there any fees imposed for MD Hub status?

5. What is the fee structure?

There are two (2) types of fees associated with MD Hub status:

- Application Fee: Covers administrative costs related to reviewing and processing the applications.
- Annual Fee: Covers ongoing compliance and monitoring activities, including but not limited to:
 - Annual compliance assessment

- System support
- On-site verification, where applicable
